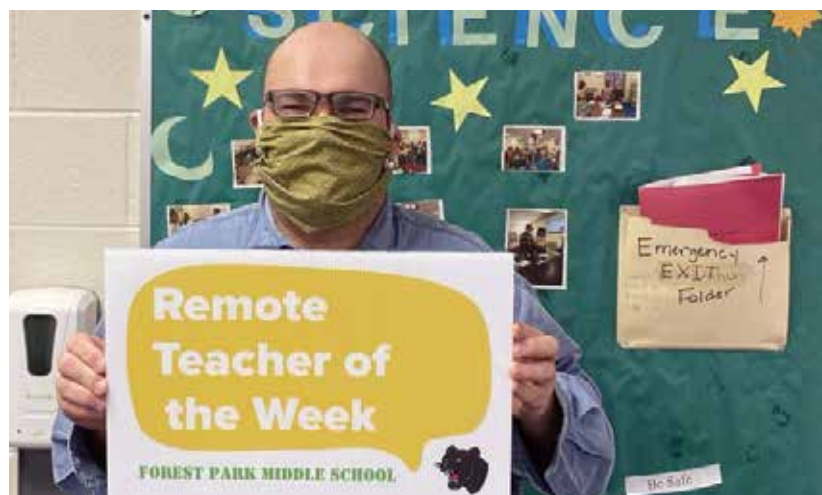

At Forest Park Middle School, we focus on social and emotional learning (SEL) – how children are feeling about themselves and others – in order to provide our students with a better foundation for healthier adjustment and academic performance as they make their unique individual journeys from sixth through eighth grade. This is especially important in a remote learning situation.

To improve the remote instruction and maintain a focus on SEL, we have created virtual homerooms or “dens”, led by advisory teachers, designed to keep smaller, diversified groups of students together as they take classes in math, science, reading, language arts and social studies from different teachers. We also created similar instructional routines for exploratory subjects such as health, Spanish, art and music. In this way, students can socialize together as they learn together.
